CONCEPT NOTE

The UfM cooperation framework on Higher Education

Cooperation on Higher Education and Research has been one of the main priorities of the Union for Mediterranean (UfM) since its establishment in 2008. While the 2007 Cairo Ministerial Declaration on Higher Education was developed outside the UfM framework, the UfM has been active on this field along three main axes: academic mobility, employability and quality of education, and cooperation through university networks, with the objective of building a common vision on university cooperation and academic mobility within the Euro-Mediterranean region.

In the framework of the Regional Dialogue on Higher Education, a Report on the Internationalisation of Higher Education in the Mediterranean was commissioned by the UfM and published in June 2021. It includes both country-specific recommendations and common themes for cooperation, with the aim of enhancing the internationalisation of higher education in the region.

A first UfM Ministerial Meeting on Higher Education

Several recent EU policy developments provide considerable momentum for the organisation of a UfM Ministerial Meeting on Higher Education:

- the New Agenda for the Mediterranean, adopted in February 2021, which attaches special importance to the field of education;
- the Communication on the European Education Area, seeking to strengthen international cooperation on education, including at regional level, to address existing and emerging challenges;
- the Digital Education Action Plan, fostering the crucial role of digital education;
- and recently (January 2022), the Communication from the European Commission on a European strategy for universities, which mentions several actions with direct impact in the UfM region, such as better relying on alumni networks, supporting consortia of worldwide leading universities to develop and implement Master programmes, or supporting transparent and fair recognition of third country qualifications.

The UfM Senior Officials agreed in October 2022 convening the first UfM Ministerial Meeting on Higher Education in 2023. This ministerial meeting should lay the bases for a renewed regional cooperation on higher education and constitute a powerful tool to give guidance to both policymakers and institutions by establishing clear priorities for cooperation. It should also acknowledge the achievements and developments of the past 15 years and affirm new commitments on the strategic importance of higher education for the development of human capital in the Euro-Mediterranean region. It will lead to a Ministerial Declaration supported by the 43 UfM Member States.

Presentation of the results of the Public Consultation in view of the UfM Ministerial Meeting on Higher Education

In view of the above, the Union for the Mediterranean launched a Public Consultation for interested parties in bringing forward cooperation in the field of higher education in the Euro-Mediterranean





region. The Consultation was open from mid-December until mid-February. The results of the survey will be presented on 17 March at Casa Mediterráneo, Alicante, Spain. The Stakeholder's Meeting is aimed at discussing the results of the Consultation so that the contribution of Higher Education Institutions and Networks may feed the Declaration to be adopted during the UfM Ministerial Meeting. On the previous day, 16 March, also at Casa Mediterráneo, a first UfM Higher Education Ad hoc Senior Officials' Meeting will be convened, to start preparing the Declaration.
